DETAILS

Virtual Day Requirements -

Students log-in to google classroom by 9:00am and respond to the opening assignment or attendance question. This documents attendance that is required by DPI for verification. Parents in K3, K4 and K5 will receive an email from their child's teacher.

The student will then complete each assignment by the end of day, 4pm. Homework will be due by 9am the following day unless otherwise assigned. Missing or late assignments are graded at the same levels as in-person assignments.

Students who have questions regarding an assignment can email the teacher or request parents to help with the communication. *(For longer Virtual days off due to required COVID isolation, a Zoom will be set up by the classroom teacher for questions and discuss progress.)*

Coming Weeks...

REMOTE LEARNING GUIDELINES:

During remote learning, students will experience online learning from their classroom teacher through a combination of synchronous (live teaching via video/Google Classroom) and asynchronous (independent assignments like homework) learning.

Students will be following a schedule that is similar to their face-to-face schedules, sent home by teachers via email. Teachers will be teaching live lessons and helping students to work through the new material.


CHECK LIST FOR SUCCESS!!



- ✓ **Student is ready for attendance and lunch count via zoom at 8:50 am**
- ✓ Student is sitting up in a space for writing, doing math, reading and learning.
- ✓ Remote briefcase is kept in a safe location for daily lessons and easily moved if there's a need to relocate to another home or caregiver.
- ✓ Student is aware that same school rules apply on Zoom as in-person, students camera is on and student is engaged, no eating, inappropriate attire, language is appropriate, no pets or other distractions. Water bottles are allowed.
- ✓ Parent understands that attendance is required, if student is sick, parent will contact teacher by 8:50am
- ✓ **Homework is due by 8:50 am the next day for full credit.**
- ✓ Teachers are available 8:30-4:00 daily.

Keep your "remote briefcase" aka Backpack all together in one place!

HOT LUNCH TO GO



TO PARTICIPATE:

Your child will need to indicate at daily attendance if they would like a hot lunch and what type of milk.

Pick up between 12:15 - 12:30 daily at the front of school.
